



"Torah Map" is a visual subject guide to the Mishneh Torah of the Rambam. In his introduction to the Mishneh Torah, the Rambam presents his codification of the entire body of Torah Law, subject by subject, in a descending but expanding order of detail. This order comprises of fourteen Books; Eighty three Hilchot (Laws); One thousand Chapters and numerous Small Halachot (individual laws or "Torah Map" portrays the content and order of the Mishneh Torah in a spatial or "geographic" relationship.

AREA, SHAPES AND SIZES

The shaped areas of the "Torah Map" depict the relative sizes of the books and the Hilchot of the Mishneh Torah according to the amount of chapters contained within the Hilchot. Hence the larger the area the more chapters are contained therein.
